South Auckland Rangers Association Football & Sports Club Club Rules Code of Conduct Parent /Guardian

As a South Auckland Rangers Football Club Parent or Guardian of a Club member and/or participant, you should meet the following requirements with regard to your conduct during any South Auckland sanctioned activity:

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others.
- Be fair, considerate and honest in all dealings with others.
- Be professional in and accept responsibility for your actions.
- Be aware of, and maintain, an uncompromising adherence to standards, rules, regulations and policies.
- Operate within the Constitution, Regulations, Policies and Procedures of NZF, NRF and South Auckland Rangers AFC.
- Refrain from any form of abuse towards others, which includes using foul language and all forms of discrimination towards others.
- Refrain from any form of victimisation towards others.
- Reject corruption, drugs, racism, violence and other dangers to our sport.
- Promote the interest of football.
- Show concern and caution towards others who may be sick or injured.
- Be a positive role model.
- Do not speak to any media in a negative way or publish any negative comment on any social media platform (including on any website) regarding South Auckland Rangers Football Club.
- Do not participate (or benefit from assisting others involved) in sports betting or gambling activity associated with football matches and/or football results in which you are participating or have been directly involved in.
- Photos of South Auckland Rangers Players/Teams should only be posted on Social Media with permission

A Parent/Guardian will:

- Agree to abide by this Code of Conduct.
- Remember that children participate in sport for their enjoyment, not the parents.
 Encourage children to participate and not force them.



- Focus on the child's efforts and performance. Encourage children always to compete according to the rules and to settle disagreements without resorting to hostility or violence.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a competition. Remember that children learn best by example.
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.
- Respect officials' decisions and teach children to do likewise.
- Show respect appreciation for coaches, officials and administrators both within the club and towards those from other organisations
- Consider safety first in all matters
